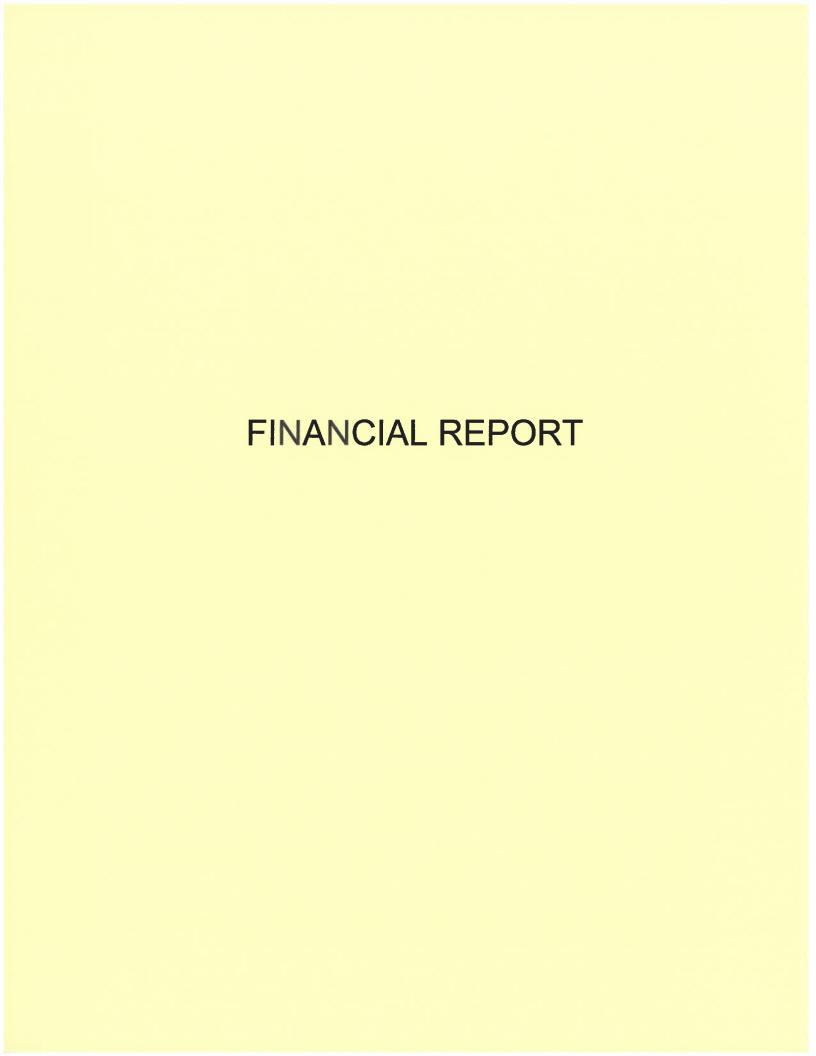

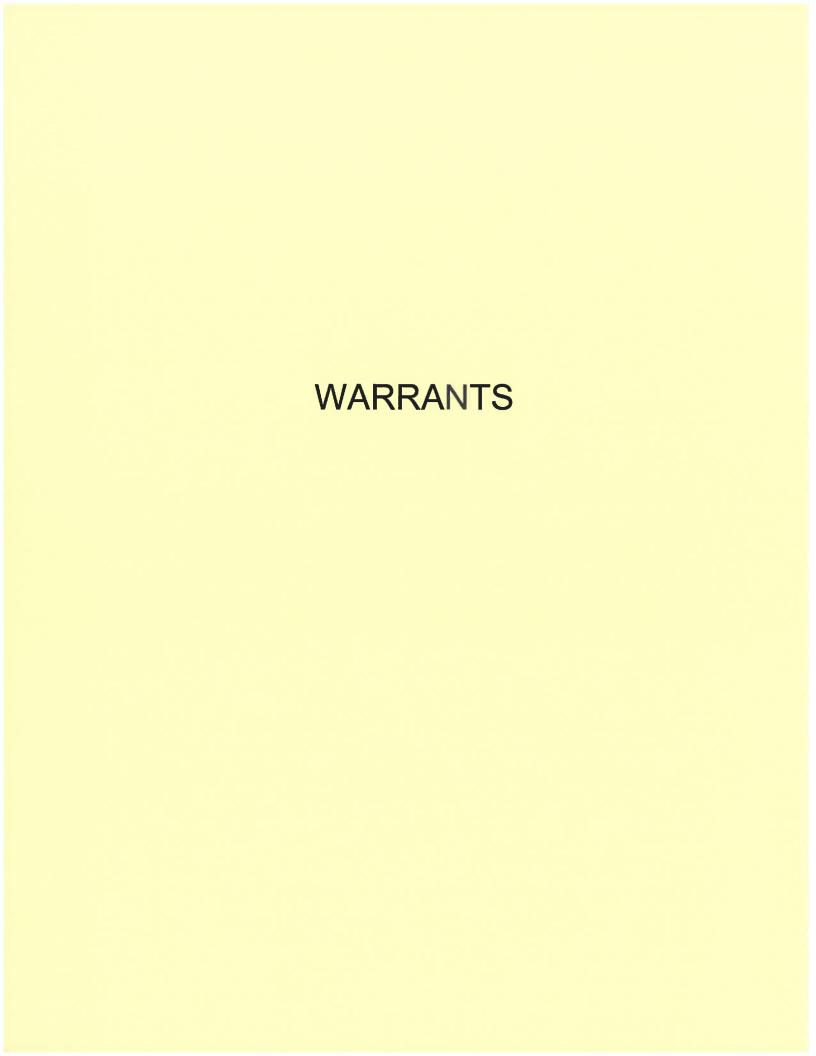

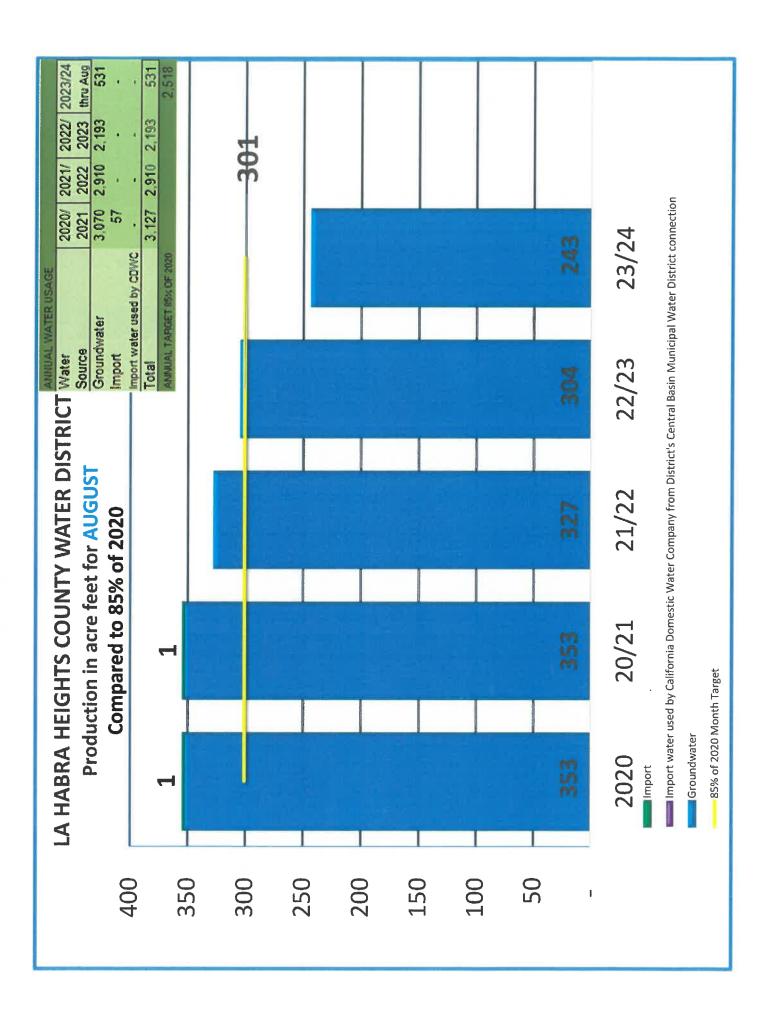

#### STEPHEN H. BROWN
